#### Description:

Next Management Theory track invites contributions to the fields of management theory and organization theory. We welcome papers that address the general significance of theorizing or reappraise key paradigms and concepts of 20th century management and organization theory as well as their adequacy to the post-millennium context. We are also keen to read systematic investigations of interfaces and interdependencies of management or organization theory and social theory. Ambitious contributions may furthermore explore possible futures of theorizing on management and organization. Furthermore, contributions problematizing, systematizing, discussing and developing our understanding of organizational change and collaboration as translation processes are invited. Selected papers will be invited for submission

to partnering journals. This track hence offers an attractive trampoline for theorizing and problematizing traditional paradigms in the field of management and organization. It is our ambition to navigate rather than (re)solve popular paradoxes and tensions and, thus, to be home for diverse, passionate or future-oriented scholarship in management and organization. Next Management Theory is your track if you wish to, e.g.:

Blend management or organization theory and foresight or futures studies

Problematize, systematize, or further develop traditional key concepts management and organization theory

Explore existing theories about change and collaboration as translation processes, problematize or further develop them

Design or redesign organizations as social systems

Ask how management and organization theory must be further developed, designed, or coded to address challenges

Build management and organization theory from new and next research methods

Present look-outs from and outlooks to recent and next management theory architectures and ventures

Tell and retell stories of management and organization

Selected submissions to the Next Management Track at EURAM 2016 have been invited to a special issue of the Journal of Accounting and Organizational Change (ABS2\*, VHB B). We will arrange for a similar opportunity for selected submissions to our track at EURAM 2017.

**Authors Guidelines and Submission Deadline:**

As an author, it is crucial to follow the guidelines and formatting instructions to prepare and submit your paper in order to have it published in proceedings.

### ONE PRESENTING AUTHOR PER PAPER SUBMISSION

Each individual is limited to one personal appearance on the programme as a presenting author. This policy precludes acceptance of papers for more than one presentation. In other words, **an author can submit and present only one paper**. However, a presenter can always be a non-presenting co-author on additional papers.

Please read the instructions carefully prior to submitting:

1. Each paper can only be submitted to ONE track.
2. Submitted papers must NOT have been previously published and if under review, must NOT appear in print before EURAM 2017 Conference.
3. To facilitate the blind review process, remove ALL authors identifying information, including acknowledgements from the text, and document/file properties. (Any submissions with author information will be automatically DELETED; author information and acknowledgements are to be included in a SEPARATE document).
4. The entire paper (title page, abstract, main text, figures, tables, references, etc.) must be in ONE document created in PDF format.
5. The maximum length of the paper is 40 pages (including ALL tables, appendices and references). The paper format should follow the [European Management Review Style Guide](#).
6. Use Times New Roman 12-pitch font, double spaced, and 1-inch (2.5 cm) margin all around.
7. Number all of the pages of the paper.
8. No changes in the paper title, abstract, authorship, track and actual paper can occur AFTER the submission deadline.
9. Check that the PDF File of your paper prints correctly and ensure that the file is virus-free. Submissions will be done on-line on the EURAM 2017 website (open as of 1 December 2016: see <http://www.euram-online.org/annual-conference-2017.html>.)
10. Only submissions in English shall be accepted for review.
11. In case of acceptance, the author or one of the co-authors should be available to present the paper at the conference. A presenting author can only present one paper at the conference.
